# Sabbatical Report

# The Revd Dr Michael Hopkins – Hillary Term 2022

# Introduction

I am very grateful to my family for their support, to my churches for making arrangements to enable me to take this time, to various colleagues for providing cover, and to the United Reformed Church and the Coward Trust for their financial support. I had a number of separate projects under an overall umbrella topic of ministry that I wished to explore. This report may be briefer than is usual, for reasons that will become obvious.

• **Objective one:** to research the use of scripture in worship, with particular attention to the way that scripture is actually used in our churches, as opposed to the theory, various aspects of dissatisfaction with the Revised Common Lectionary, and to explore alternative lectionaries and their flaws.

I am grateful to the Revd Dr Elaine Colechin and the Revd Dr John Bradbury, who advised me on the design and analysis of an appropriate questionnaire, and to colleagues who road-tested it. The questionnaire was circulated throughout the United Reformed Church, and online to other denominations, and generated significantly in excess of 1000 responses. This was ten times greater rate of response than I had expected. I am also grateful to the Revd John Proctor, who suggested a number of books to read, and approaches to consider. This is been written up, and has now been submitted to a potential publisher as a book proposal. As such, I cannot publish the work myself unless it is rejected by the publisher.

• **Objective two:** to research the possibility of a proposal for an up-to-date book on the nature and work of ministry from a Free Church perspective, and to write the proposal if the research supports that.

This became a little diffuse and at times, and took more work to pin down than I had hoped. I am grateful to a number of colleagues who offered various pieces of advice and acted as sounding boards. In particular, I am grateful to the Revd Dr Paul Beasley Murray, a baptist minister and a prolific author, who helped me to focus my ideas and refine my thinking. A proposal for a book has been submitted to a publisher.

• **Objective three:** to research the possibility of a proposal for an up-to-date book on pastoral care, and to write the proposal if the research supports that.

I undertook a full range of research, and identified a significant gap in the market for a book as I had hoped. I submitted a proposal to Canterbury Press, which was accepted. As a consequence, I have signed a contract with them, and the book will be published in 2023. It is a volume likely to be of primary use to all lay people involved in pastoral care and for ministers leading, supervising, and training such work.

• **Objective four:** to research the possibility of a proposal for an up-to-date book on preaching, and to write the proposal if the research supports that.

I found two current books, of which I was previously unaware, and which cover this area. There is no need of, or market for, another book in this area.

• **Objective five:** to research more on Mary Anning and her links to Congregationalism, with a view to a possible article for the Journal of the United Reformed Church History Society.

I am particularly grateful to Professor Hugh Torrens of Keele University, and the Revd Tom Goodhue, a Methodist minister in New York, who are both scholars of Mary Anning and kindly pointed me in the direction of various publications and resources. This research was undertaken in a variety of libraries, and a paper has been submitted for possible publication to the Journal of the United Reformed Church History Society.

• **Objective six:** attending a conference on Leading Your Church Into Growth, and applying that to my pastorate.

I attended the conference and I was deeply impressed both by the calibre of the material and of the people leading the course. I had been somewhat sceptical, as I had not been impressed by an introductory webinar, but was encouraged by a number of colleagues who had attended the actual course. I am glad I took their advice, because it is perhaps the most significant training that I have undertaken since ordination. On that basis, I would heartily recommend it to everyone.

I had been expecting to prepare a report for the pastorate on how this might be taken forwards. However, I now understand a report in itself is pointless. People need to understand at least something of what it's about, decide whether to explore it further, and then probably run the 'local' version of the course for people. Telling people won't work – we need to think it through together and work it out between us.

To that end, I intend to use some material in worship, and in a Church Meeting for the purposes of a conversation, with the hope of enough people being interested and enthused for me to run the 'local' version of the course. My sense is that the Farnham congregation in particular is actually ready and ripe for this.

# • Personal growth

I was delighted to step 'off the hamster wheel', and rest from normal activities. I have enjoyed attending church with Rosie and Joanna, and also the wonderful opportunity to join the congregation in a number of local churches, and to see the reality of those churches rather than my preconceptions of them. I have had the time to start the IAM advanced driving course, which was held over from 2021 because of Covid. I have found the headspace and inspiration to come up with a suggestion for managing pastoral care within the Spire Church. I have benefitted enormously from a number of special trips, namely a week at Keld, and time at Gladstone's Library. Both trips felt like a drop in the ocean, and I shall need to return to both very special places again. Above all, although I have worked hard, it has been different from my usual work, and a glad opportunity to re-engage with a significant backlog of reading, and to once more exercise critical thinking. I feel that I have re-gained a perspective on what is "work" and what is "hobby", and an opportunity to reflect upon work-life balance.
